Historical Geology

By RAYMOND C. MOORE, Professor of Geology, University of Kansas.
665 pages, 6 x 9, illustrated. \$4.00

The physical and biologic aspects of earth history are well correlated, but are segregated in major units based on eras or suberas. Principles of interpreting the geologic record are developed on the basis of study of a definite region, the Grand

Canyon District. Emphasis is placed on the illustrative aids. Block diagrams are especially numerous. Figures on plates are identified by lettering on the plates. The book is unusually authoritative, accurate, and up to date.

A comprehensive treatment of the materials of the earth, the processes that operate at the earth's surface, and those which have operated in the past to form the earth. Unusual clarity is achieved

through a logical organization of material: the early chapters discuss the processes more commonly observed in operation; later chapters deal with those less frequently encountered.

This revision of the author's classic *Igneous Rocks and Their Origin* is essentially a new work. It takes account of the recent advances made in cosmogony, geophysics, experimental petrology, vol-

canology and general geology, and brings up to date a statement of the principal facts known about eruptive rocks. The book also tests a general "theory of the earth."
